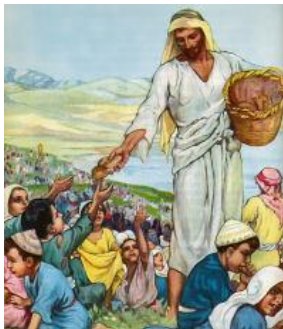

### Everyday Evangelization & Eucharistic Year of Mission

Each year that we read from the Gospel of St. Mark, we are blessed with five Sundays of hearing St. John's account of the Multiplication of the Loaves from John, chapter 6. It's often referred to as the Bread of Life Discourse. This Sunday is the first of these readings. As we heard last week, Jesus sees the crowds continuing to follow Him because of His healing and preaching. In the Gospel for today, Jesus recognizes their need of hunger, and so commands that the apostles feed the 5,000. Like then, there are many people in today's world and in our own community who hunger for meaning and for hope.

At the conclusion of the National Eucharistic Congress, Bishop Andrew Cozzens, the chair of the Eucharistic Revival, and Bishop of Crookston, MN, invited participants to participate in the "Walk With One" initiative. He said, "Commit yourself to walking with one person. Commit yourself to becoming a Eucharistic missionary, someone who lives deeply a Eucharistic life, and having received that gift, allows themselves to be given as gift." Jesus noticed the needs of the 5,000. Ask the Holy Spirit to put on your heart 1 person that needs to hear the Good News. Then "walk" with that person in a relationship of respect, humility, goodness, kindness and patience. Befriend them as a disciple of Jesus, seeing them as a child of God. By doing so, more in deeds than in words, you will help them know the love and mercy of Jesus.

### **World Day Against Trafficking In Persons**

World Day Against Trafficking in Persons (WDATIP) is observed annually on July 30th to raise awareness of human trafficking and to promote and protect the rights of its victims. A United Nations resolution was established on the day it was first observed in 2014. The 2024 theme is "*Leave No Child Behind in the Fight Against Human Trafficking*" and focuses on the vulnerability of children and the need for urgent action to end child trafficking.

Southwest Wisconsin, like many other regions, is not immune to the tragedies of human trafficking. While it may not be a daily occurrence for our local law enforcement, we cannot turn a blind eye to its existence in our community. The urgency of this issue is underscored by the following reasons:

---Did you know that a significant portion of trafficking, 25-47%, is carried out by caregivers? Shockingly, 50% of these cases involve mothers trafficking their children. This underscores the need for all of us to be vigilant and responsible.

---Did you know that, according to the FBI, at any given time, there are an estimated 750,000 child predators active online? This alarming statistic should serve as a stark reminder of the importance of digital vigilance in protecting our children.

---Did you know that the epidemic of fatherlessness, where children grow up without a father figure, is breaking down the nuclear family and propelling the culture of exploitation? This lack of a strong male role model can make children more vulnerable to exploitation, including human trafficking.

How do we combat human trafficking on a local level? It starts with educating yourself. There are many resources available to help you identify and prevent issues. One great faith-based resource is a man named Jaco Booyens. He is a renowned advocate for human trafficking victims, and his ministry, 'Jaco Booyens Ministries,' is focused on rescuing and rehabilitating victims. His website is a wealth of information and resources.

The most impactful thing you can do to prevent human trafficking is to ask questions and be involved in your children's or grandchildren's lives. Be a nosy parent or grandparent and see what they are doing online. You have to be persistent and consistent in your approach to monitoring what they are doing online. If you're a man, be a strong male role model for the young people in your life. Be vigilant; it could save a child from tragedy!
