

The Waters of Baptism

When new sod is put in, it needs constant saturation with water. Landscapers say that this “knits” the sod to the soil. The same when a branch is grafted onto a tree: the poultice that joins them at the splice must be kept wet at all times. Water is the stuff that binds the very cells of our bodies together. No wonder religions throughout all times and cultures have used it so prominently. When Jesus stepped into the Jordan for baptism, he “knit” himself to what had come before him. By going to the Jordan, he made himself one with the people of Israel who had crossed it into their Promised Land. With John the Baptist, Christ wove himself into the prophetic tradition that heralded the coming reign of God. He had become fully human in the waters of Mary’s womb, and by partaking in the rite of the baptism of repentance, Jesus identified himself with our sinful, frail humanity. It is through the waters of baptism that Christ continues to graft new members onto his Body, the Church; through these waters we are cleansed from sin and filled with the promise of grace, given our destiny for eternal life. The BAPTISM OF THE LORD, a Forgotten Feast

We remember many important events in the life of Jesus. We have creches at Christmas to remember his birth in a stable, and we have the magi and the camels to remember their journey from afar to adore Christ.

We have pictures of the Last Supper in our homes and churches. We keep the crucifix in an honored place in our homes and at the center of our devotional art in Church. But we have far fewer images of the Baptism of Jesus. Yet all four Gospels describe his baptism in the Jordan and the revelation that Jesus is the beloved Son of the Father, and his favor rests with him. Details of Jesus’ birth are only given in two Gospels, but the all the Evangelists considered Jesus’s baptism a very important and revelatory event so they included it in their Gospel.

Why is the Baptism of Jesus in the Jordan so important? He did not need to do it to repent of sin because he was sinless. But Jesus told John the Baptist it was necessary to fulfill all righteousness. Christ was showing the people of his time and all of us that the journey to God requires forgiveness of sins from God and our cooperation with a commitment of faith. The voice from the heavens, the voice of God, revealed that Jesus was the divine Son of God. Christ’s Baptism in the Jordan was one of the key times this truth was revealed. Many of us were baptized as infants because of someone else’s faith. We are called as a new year begins to recommit to our faith in Jesus Christ.

Our Mission/Vocation

Through our baptism, God calls us all to live our faith and seek our vocation to become a deacon, priest, religious sister, married or single person. Perhaps God is calling you or someone you know to the priesthood or consecrated life. Let us have courage to follow our heart.

We are all called to love and serve God and one another as our true vocation. As we continue to walk in the light of Christ and to serve our Lord with our whole heart, mind and soul, may we be filled with the love of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ and seek to forgive all who have hurt us.

It is important that all Catholics:

1. Take time to pray for vocations to the priesthood and consecrated life.
2. Reflect on our own vocation and strengthen our personal relationship with Christ
3. Educate our young people about the importance of silent prayer and taking time to truly listen to God
4. Talk about vocations with our family members
5. Participate in the Sacraments and attend Mass every Sunday as a family.

O Father, you desire all of us to be happy. Stir up the grace of a religious vocation in the hearts of many men and women.

The Sign of the Cross

At the beginning of our prayer, we make the sign of the cross together. This sign, simple and powerful, operates on many levels. We trace the sign of the cross over our bodies, reminding ourselves that the cross of Christ has become our source of resurrection, life, and grace. With this sign, we also profess our faith in the Trinity: the presider does not say "in the names," but "in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit"—three persons, one God. The sign of the cross is also a baptismal reminder, for every sign of the cross echoes the words spoken over us at our baptism, which marked our entry into the saving mystery of Christ. This many-layered sign is also our primary sign of blessing: the cross is traced over people, places, and things upon which we ask God to impart divine benediction.

In blessing ourselves with the sign of the cross at the beginning of Mass, we acknowledge the mystery that has gathered us together: that Christ, the crucified and risen One, is living, and that we are members of his Body. SAINT HILARY (c. 315-367) January 13

Born in Poitiers, France to a pagan family, little is known about St. Hilary's life before he became a bishop. Hilary grew up apparently without any significant Christian influence, but received an comprehensive education in the Latin and Greek classics. He rigorously studied both Greek philosophy and the Bible. Like other early Church Fathers, he came to accept the truth of the Bible by recognizing its compatibility with philosophy and the sciences.

However, and it was not until 345 – by which time he was already married, and had a daughter– that Hilary committed himself to full membership in the Catholic Church and was baptized with the rest of his family. By 353, the people of Poitiers called for him to be made their bishop.

This position involved tremendous responsibility, as well as significant personal sacrifice. While the early church permitted some married men to become bishops, they were traditionally required to practice celibacy within marriage, and many like Hilary adopted a radically simplified lifestyle.

Moreover, Hilary's election as the Bishop of Poitiers coincided with the second wave of the Church's first great doctrinal controversy. Although the Council of Nicaea in 325 had confirmed the Church's rejection of Arianism – which claimed Jesus was only human, not divine – powerful forces within both the Church and the empire clung to the heresy.

Only a few years after becoming a bishop, Hilary found himself virtually alone in defending Jesus' deity before a hostile crowd of bishops in the southern French region of Gaul. The bishops appealed to Emperor Constantius II, who favored a modified version of Arianism and declared Hilary's exile from Gaul to Phrygia. There he was inspired to mount an even greater defense of orthodox theology and wrote his most important work, "On the Trinity," showing the Bible's consistent witness to the central mystery of Christian faith.

The Orthodox bishop worked with groups of clergy and faithful to bring them into full adherence with tradition.

Hilary also traveled to Constantinople during his exile, to explain to the city's bishops why their emperor was not orthodox. After the death of Constantius II in 361, Hilary was able to return to his diocese at Poitiers. Once exiled for opposing Arianism in Gaul, he lived to see it completely condemned in the local church after his return.

Celebrate Life

"Whoever is moved by love begins to perceive what "life" really is. He begins to perceive the meaning of the word of hope that we encountered in the Baptismal Rite: from faith I await "eternal life" - the true life which, whole and unthreatened, in all its fullness, is simply life. Jesus, who said that he had come so that we might have life and have it in its fullness, in abundance (cf. Jn 10:10), has also explained to us what "life" means: "this is eternal life, that they know you the only true God, and Jesus Christ whom you have sent" (Jn 17:3). Life in its true sense is not something we have exclusively in or from ourselves: it is a relationship. And life in its totality is a relationship with him who is the source of life. If we are in relation with him who does not die, who is Life itself and Love itself, then we are in life. Then we 'live'" – Pope Benedict XVI, Encyclical on Hope, November 30, 2007.


