

Baptism of the Lord

Perhaps you noticed that this year we didn't celebrate the Baptism of the Lord this Sunday, but instead on last Monday, the day after Epiphany. Why the shift? It all has to do with regional calendars. Within certain general boundaries, every national conference of bishops is able to set its own liturgical calendar according to how it is felt to benefit the people in that region most. So, for example, the Epiphany of the Lord is celebrated January 6 on the Church's universal calendar. But the bishops of the United States decided that, for the benefit of the faithful, it would be better for Epiphany to be celebrated on a Sunday every year. So here in the States we see Epiphany's date vary from January 2 to January 8. The biggest problem this presents is that the Baptism of the Lord, which is normally celebrated on the Sunday after the Epiphany, would push back the whole liturgical calendar by a week on the years when the Sunday celebration of the Epiphany falls on January 7 or 8, putting the U.S. out of sync with the rest of the Catholic world at least until Lent. To avoid that scenario, the U. S. bishops decreed that in those years the Baptism of the Lord would fall on the Monday after Epiphany, leaving the rest of the calendar intact. Copyright © J. S. Fr. Greg's Reflections

Jesus is born of the Virgin Mary

"The Word of God became flesh and dwelt among us. To those who accepted him, he gave power to become children of God." Jn 1:14, 12

Last week we spoke about the radiance and light of Christ, saying that we take on the light of Christ by living moral upright lives in accordance with the truth because the grace of Christ resides and flows through those who keep His commandments. The truth of the dignity of each human person from conception until natural death is one of these fundamental truths that helps shed the light of Christ into the world.

January 23rd is National Day of prayer for the Legal Protection of the Unborn. "There is hope and healing for mothers and fathers who now regret their abortion and deeply grieve the loss of their little child. A new day is dawning; be not afraid. Seek the help you need. Your wounded heart can be healed through the love and mercy of Jesus Christ. Go to Him, seek Him, and receive the help you desire to be healed and live in hope once again. There are millions and millions who regret their abortions. You are not alone."

"Walking with Moms in Need: The Catholic Church has a long history of service to those who are most vulnerable. From pregnancy care centers, to foster care and adoption agencies, and from maternity homes to parish-based ministries, the Church consistently bears witness in word and deed to the beauty and dignity of every human life-including both mother and child.

In the Church's teachings there is a hierarchy of truths; example: The Trinity and Mary as Mother of God are both true but the Trinity supersedes the truth that Mary is the Mother of God. The 'right to life' is like this, it supersedes all the other rights and obligations owed to man without alienating them because we need not talk about rights or obligations for a person if they aren't alive. As a Church we are called to concretely respond to the demands of protecting human life by supporting parents who find their pregnancy challenging for whatever reason; as well, as those parents struggling to raise the children that they have. We can respond also by helping educate others, especially our youth, about the truths of the dignity of each human person and to be Pro-Life is to give people a choice. Lastly, we are called to concretely respond by assisting political candidates that uphold Pro-Life values to get elected in both local and national elections.

SAINT AGNES (died 304) January 21

Writing about Saint Agnes in the year 377, Saint Ambrose, Bishop of Milan, declared: "This is a virgin's birthday into heaven: let us imitate her chastity! And a martyr's heavenly birthday: let us offer ourselves in sacrifice!" Chastity: mastery of oneself in order to give of oneself whether in the priestly, religious, married, or single state. Sacrifice: "to make holy," to set someone or something apart for service. Ambrose knew these virtues indispensable for discipleship, but challenging to practice in his world-or our own. Barely a teenager, Agnes faced gruesome tortures bravely and, when ordered to worship pagan gods, boldly made the Sign of the Cross instead. Thus, her youthful courage strengthened adult believers who wavered under persecution or grew indifferent when persecutions passed. To bestow on Agnes its highest honor and keep her witness fresh in believers' hearts, the Church inscribed her name at the heart of the Eucharistic liturgy, in the Roman Canon (Eucharistic Prayer I), until Vatican II the Roman Church's only Eucharistic Prayer.—Peter Scagnelli, Copyright © J. Isaiah embraces his role as God's servant and works to bring glory not only to Israel, but to the entire world. In a similar way, Saint Paul identifies himself as Christ's witness in the world and reminds the Corinthians of their life goal: "to be holy." St. Charles School

The virtue the students are studying this month is fidelity. "Fidelity expresses constancy in keeping one's given word. God is faithful." (CCC 2365) Fidelity means being faithful to promises and commitments.

Saint Gianna Beretta Molla was a wife, mother, and pediatrician in Italy. Dr. Gianna gave special attention to mothers, babies, elderly, and poor in her medical practice. She considered her work a mission from God and exercised great care in fulfilling her responsibilities. Gianna and Pietro Molla were married in 1955. In 1961 toward the end of her second month of pregnancy with their fourth child, Gianna was diagnosed a serious condition that required surgery. The surgeon suggested that Gianna undergo an abortion in order to save her life. Gianna replied, "If you must decide between me and the child, do not hesitate. Choose the child – I insist on it. Save baby." On the morning of April 21, 1962, Gianna Emanuela was born. Despite all efforts and treatments to save both of them, Saint Gianna died on the morning of April 28 at the age of 39.

Her husband described Gianna's life as "an act and a perennial action of faith and charity; it was a non-stop search for the will of God for every decision and for every work, with prayer and meditation, Holy Mass and the Eucharist".

On April 24, 1994, Pope John Paul II beatified Gianna Beretta Molla. At the beatification ceremony, the Holy Father said that Gianna's act of self-sacrifice was possible only after a lifetime of preparation. Saint Gianna was canonized in 2004, which is rather extraordinary, especially since her husband and children were still living at the time of her canonization. She continues to remind the Church and the world of the virtue of fidelity, because of her faithful commitment to her family and to God. We are being called to heroism by our choice of life.

Let us ask Saint Gianna to intercede for us that we might be faithful.


