Catechism of the Catholic Church

528 The *Epiphany* is the manifestation of Jesus as Messiah of Israel, Son of God and Savior of the world. The great feast of Epiphany celebrates the adoration of Jesus by the wise men (*magi*) from the East, together with his baptism in the Jordan and the wedding feast at Cana in Galilee. In the magi, representatives of the neighboring pagan religions, the Gospel sees the first-fruits of the nations, who welcome the good news of salvation through the Incarnation. The magi's coming to Jerusalem in order to pay homage to the king of the Jews shows that they seek in Israel, in the messianic light of the star of David, the one who will be king of the nations. Their coming means that pagans can discover Jesus and worship him as Son of God and Savior of the world only by turning towards the Jews and receiving from them the messianic promise as contained in the Old Testament. The Epiphany shows that "the full number of the nations" now takes its "place in the family of the patriarchs", and acquires *Israelitica dignitas* (is made "worthy of the heritage of Israel").

Fr. Greg's Reflections
The Epiphany of the Lord

“The Epiphany is the manifestation of Jesus as the Messiah of Israel, Son of God and Savior of the world. The great feast of Epiphany celebrates the adoration of Jesus by the wise men (magi) from the East, together with his baptism in the Jordan and the wedding feast at Cana in Galilee.” CCC 528

We find within the Liturgy for Epiphany the use of the words ‘splendor’, ‘light’, and ‘shine’. In the opening prayer of the Vigil Mass it reads: “May the splendor of your majesty, O Lord, we pray, shed its light upon our hearts, that we may pass through the shadows of this world and reach the brightness of our eternal home.” In the first reading (Is. 60:1-6) we read:

“Rise up in splendor, Jerusalem! Your light has come, the glory of the Lord shines upon you... upon you the Lord shines, and over you appears his glory. Nations shall walk by your light, and kings by your shining radiance... Then you shall be radiant at what you see, your heart shall throb and overflow, for the riches of the sea shall be emptied out before you, the wealth of nations shall be brought to you.”

This question arose in my heart as I prayed with this: What is this splendor and light and how do I possess this shining radiance? St. John Paul II wrote an important Encyclical entitled, “The Splendor of Truth” (Veritatis Splendor) and the opening sentence gives us the key to answering this question.

“Called to salvation through faith in Jesus Christ, *“the true light that enlightens everyone” (Jn 1:9), people become “light in the Lord” and “children of light” (Eph 5:8), and are made holy by “obedience to the truth” (1 Pet 1:22).*”

For us to truly grasp and make the Epiphany ours, I invite you to read and meditate upon this very important Church teaching presented in the Encyclical; take time to read the entire document. It presents to us that there is Universal Truth who is Jesus Christ and this truth sheds light on our humanity through her moral teachings. Living moral lives in obedience to the truth of Jesus Christ is the way to receive the light and thus radiate it. This document has been controversial similar to that of Humane Vitae because it challenges the worlds view toward human fulfillment.

Don’t forget to bless the door way of your home with the Epiphany blessing (20 +C +M +B 23). You may use chalk which is an incarnational image reminding us of the dust of the earth from which we were made. The CMB also stands for Christus Mansionem Benedicat (May Christ bless this house). There is a special blessing of Holy Water that can be prayed on the Feast of Epiphany.

Epiphany House Blessing

You can celebrate Epiphany at home with a blessing using the initials of the magi’s traditional names (Casper, Melchior, Balthasar), four crosses, and the new year’s numerals.

Materials: a piece of chalk and a small container of holy water. Gather with family members, friends, and perhaps some neighbors at the front door.

Leader: In the (+) name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

We sign this doorway with four crosses and the numerals of the new year. [20 + C + M + B + 23]

Let us pray: May Christ bless this house! **ALL:** Amen!

Each room of the house is sprinkled with holy water and ALL say “AMEN!” after each room is blessed.

Living room:

Where two or three are gathered in your name, Lord, you are present. Bless this room, O Lord.

Kitchen:

Give us this day our daily bread.

Bless this room, O Lord.

Dining room:

Prepare us for the heavenly banquet.

Bless this room, O Lord.

Bedrooms:

Stay with us Lord, when night has come.

Bless this room, O Lord.

Bathroom:

Cleanse us from all sin. Bless this room, O Lord.

All return to the front door to pray together.

Leader: Let us pray as Jesus taught us:

Our Father . . .

The leader sprinkles all present with holy water.

Bless this household through all days to come, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, forever and ever. **ALL:** Amen!

Saint André Bessette - Jan. 6

St. André was born in 1845 into a large and very poor family from Quebec, Canada. The 8th of twelve children, he was named Alfred at his baptism. By the time he was 12 both of his parents had died and the children were sent to live with friends and relatives.

Alfred spent thirteen years doing hard manual labor, including factory and farm work in the northeastern United States. At age 25, he returned to Montreal and the parish priest noted his generous spirit and deep faith. He recommended the young man to the Congregation of the Holy Cross in Montreal with a note stating: "I am sending you a saint."

Alfred took the name of this parish priest, André, and after much difficulty was allowed to join the Congregation as a Brother. Due to his poor health, he was given the simple job of minding the door of the Notre Dame College in Montreal. He welcomed guests, delivered mail, and ran errands.

Miraculously, sick people who visited him were cured by his touch and prayers. Brother André insisted it was God and St. Joseph. This began a many decades-long ministry to the sick. The lines of people became so long that he could no longer do his job at the school door. He attended to people all day and needed four secretaries to handle the 80,000 letters he received each year. Over time, he began to build a shrine to St. Joseph on a hill he could see from his window. He did not live to see it completed and died on Jan. 6 1937. At his canonization in October 2010, Pope Benedict XVI said that Saint Andre "lived the beatitude of the pure of heart."

Celebrate Life

“Life is always a good. ... Why is life a good? This question is found everywhere in the Bible, and from the very first pages it receives a powerful and amazing answer. The life which God gives man is quite different from the life of all other living creatures, inasmuch as man, although formed from the dust of the earth (cf. Gen 2:7, 3:19; Job 34:15; Ps 103:14; 104:29), is a manifestation of God in the world, a sign of his presence, a trace of his glory (cf. Gen 1:26-27; Ps 8:6). This is what Saint Irenaeus of Lyons wanted to emphasize in his celebrated definition: ‘Man, living man, is the glory of God’. Man has been given a sublime dignity, based on the intimate bond which unites him to his Creator: in man there shines forth a reflection of God himself” (The Gospel of Life, n. 34).

At 18 days a baby’s heart begins to beat and by the 43rd day after conception a baby’s brain is coordinating movements. All of a baby’s organs are functioning at 8 weeks and a baby can smile, suck his/her thumb and make a fist by 12 weeks.




