


CHRIST, THE KING

St. Hubert, Patron Saint of Hunters

Born around 705 A.D to a noble family, Hubert had the freedom and wealth do as he pleased, and what pleased him most was hunting. But after his wife died, hunting became an obsession for him. Hubert devoted nearly all his time to the sport. What he didn't know, however, was that God was pursuing him.

One Good Friday as the faithful venture to church, Hubert was not among them. He had no time for pious devotions. He was in the woods hunting a magnificent stag. Hubert was closing in when, without warning, the stag turned and looked directly at him. Suspended between its majestic antlers was a glowing crucifix. Hubert was dumbfounded. A voice from heaven boomed, "*Hubert, unless thou turnest to the Lord, and leadest an holy life, thou shalt quickly go down into hell.*" Deeply moved, Hubert asked what he must do. He was instructed to go seek Lambert, the holy bishop of his diocese, to learn what God required of him.

The vision was the beginning of a profound conversion that led Hubert to renounce his wealth and titles, study for the priesthood, and ultimately to be consecrated a bishop. As a bishop, Hubert was known for his great holiness, and especially for his daring evangelization of the rather dangerous pagans who lived in the Ardennes forest. This zealous missionary efforts earned him the reputation of being a skillful "hunter of souls."


