

## Divine Mercy Sunday

Sister Faustina was a young, uneducated nun in a convent of the Congregation of Sisters of Our Lady of Mercy in Poland during the 1930s. She came from a poor family and she had only three years of simple education, so hers were the humblest tasks in the convent. However, she received extraordinary revelations -or messages -from our Lord Jesus. Jesus asked Sr. Faustina to record these experiences, which she compiled into notebooks. These notebooks are known today as the *Diary of Saint Maria Faustina Kowalska*, and the words contained within are God's loving message of Divine Mercy. After scrupulously examining the writings of Sr. Faustina and finding them without significant error, the Church declared her heroic virtues. With the required miracles, Pope John Paul II then beatified and canonized her in 2000. At her canonization, he also drew on the insight from her writings and declared that the "Second Sunday of Easter, will be called 'Divine Mercy Sunday.'" ## How to Keep the Lord's Day Holy from the Diocese of Madison *Go Make Disciples*, Sept. 2020

The commandment to keep holy the Lord's day means we should dedicate the day first and foremost to the worship of God and the cultivation of the most important human values, such as family, culture, and service to those in need. The traditional emphasis on resting from work is not primarily for its own sake, as if the goal were simply to spend the whole day on the couch; the purpose of holy leisure is to set aside as much as we can of all those less important things that occupy so much of our time in order to make room for the most important things: God, family, community.

What about priests who have to "work" on Sunday by saying Mass? What about parish staff or catechists who "work" on Sundays by teaching religious education classes or running other parish programs? Are they breaking the commandment? No! It's important to remember that the point of resting from "work" on Sundays for most people is to free them from their mundane obligations so that they can devote themselves to God in a special way on Sundays. But for a priest or anyone else whose "work" participates directly in the work of God and the mission of the Church, there is no need to rest from this kind of "work" on Sundays. In fact, Sundays are especially well-suited for spiritual "work." They should, however, try to make time for some relaxation and recreation at some point during the week.

Take some time to consider how you spend your Sundays, as you work to keep the Sabbath holy. If Sunday isn't your favorite day of the week (or your kids' favorite day of the week), then you are probably doing it wrong. We will be listing ideas in the bulletin to help you.

## St. John Church, Patch Grove



### Saint Catherine of Siena-April 29

(1347-1380)

Imagine the pope receiving a young woman still in her twenties who addresses him as "my sweet Christ on earth," then orders: "Get back to Rome where you belong!" Amazingly, Gregory XI complied! Yet this was but one astonishing incident in the extraordinary life of Catherine of Siena, a truly unique medieval woman. Youngest of twenty-five children, Catherine refused marriage and became a Dominican Tertiary at sixteen, cloistering herself at home in contemplative prayer, austere penances, and mystical experiences, culminating in "spiritual espousal" to Christ. Then, incarnating the Dominican ideal of "passing on to others the fruits of contemplation," Catherine left her solitude to care for the poor, nurse the sick, comfort the dying, and bury the dead. Increasingly renowned for converting souls and healing bodies, she was sought after to broker peace during civil wars and Church schisms. All this, and like Jesus, whom she called "my "Divine Spouse," she died at thirty-three! Four hundred letters and her spiritual classic *The Dialogue* inspired Paul VI to name her, together with Teresa of Ávila, the first women "doctors of the Church." —Peter Scagnelli, Copyright © J. S. ## Reflection



"Jesus said to them again, 'Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you.'" (JOHN 20:21)

Peace – the first gift of the risen Lord. Just as Jesus sent the apostles out into the world, so too, He sends us. As disciples of Jesus, we are called to be compassionate and merciful; and not with just those who are our friends, but also with our "enemies." Think of someone in your life who you need to reconcile with. Call them or better yet, go visit them.

## Difficulty, Survival, and Glory

In Revelation, John the Evangelist tells us what we can expect as followers of the risen Jesus: distress, endurance, and a kingdom. Although we are only eight days into our fifty-day Easter feasting, we cannot ignore the distress weighing down our daily lives. Jesus' resurrection does not erase individual suffering, but his glorious triumph over death cultivates endurance in our hearts. We remember that Jesus did not spare himself, and we ask for the strength to endure as he did. Imitating Christ helps us grow as members of God's royal family. As beloved citizens of the Kingdom of God, we recognize our kinship with all people. Peter demonstrates his care for others as he heals multitudes of broken, suffering people. In the Gospel, Thomas accepts his own spiritual healing when Jesus helps him to believe. In times of difficulty, survival, and glory, we borrow Thomas' declaration of faith: "My Lord and my God!" ## Celebrate Life

Pope John Paul II declared the Sunday after Easter to be Divine Mercy Sunday. Many of the faithful pray the Chaplet of Divine Mercy regularly. There is a link between this devotion and the pro-life movement. Fr. Seraphim Michalenko, MIC, who was a principal translator of St. Faustina's diary, and the postulator of her cause of canonization, writes the following:

"On at least three occasions, from 8:00-11:00 in the evening, she felt like her insides were being torn apart. She suffered so much that she thought she was going to die. The doctors couldn't figure out what was ailing her, and no medication was able to alleviate her sufferings. Later, she was given to understand that she was undergoing those pains for mothers who were aborting their children (Diary, 1276).

"On another occasion, she had a vision of an angel coming with thunderbolts to destroy one of the most beautiful cities of her country. And she felt powerless to do anything about it (Diary, 474). What antidote did the Lord give her? The Chaplet of Divine Mercy. [She explained] that the city was to be chastised for its sins, **primarily the sin of abortion.**" ("Wombs of Mercy," Marian Helpers Bulletin, Summer 1995, p.13.)."

At 18 days a baby's heart begins to beat and by the 43rd day after conception a baby's brain is coordinating movements. All of a baby's organs are functioning at 8 weeks and a baby can smile, suck his/her thumb and make a fist by 12 weeks.
