

Evangelization—Bishop Hyning

Bishop Hyning wants all Catholics in the diocese to commit to evangelization. The first step is for us to accept and live the Good News, the Gospel. We cannot share what we do not possess ourselves. He has four simple things that we can do to grow in faith.

1. Develop or strengthen a habit of going to confession regularly, ideally at least once per month.
2. Prioritize Sunday as the Lord's Day in your lives especially by attending Mass.
3. Commit to spending at least 15 minutes per day in prayer, ideally praying often with Scripture.
4. Make asceticism (voluntary practices of self-denial) a regular part of their lives, beginning with at least the mandatory observance of Fridays as penitential fasting days throughout the year.



LORD, SEND OUT YOUR SPIRIT

In today's responsorial psalm the Church sings out: "Lord, send out your Spirit, and renew the face of the earth." All three readings describe how God has answered that prayer already.


In the first reading from the Acts of the Apostles and in the Gospel passage from John, we read of astonishing events that called the cowering disciples to step out of hiding and proclaim news that would condemn them and change the world forever! In the second reading Paul's words reach out into the future to us: "we were all given to drink of one Spirit" (1 Corinthians 12:13).

A REFLECTION ON "SPIRIT" and THE HOLY SPIRIT

When we are young we often equate spirit with demonstration of great energy in sports, excitement for favorite foods, and activities we are passionate about. As we get older we seek energy to get through the day and we long for more energy or "spirit". Our Catholic vision is that all life and energy come through the spirit of God, the Holy Spirit.

The poetic Sequence prayer of the Pentecost Mass has a beautiful way of directing our prayer to open our heart to the Holy Spirit.



The Gifts of the Holy Spirit

Because we can not directly see or touch spiritual realities, it is easy to dismiss them. I think it is important to think deeply about the Holy Spirit as one person of the Holy Trinity and what the gifts of the Holy Spirit do for us. We can first go to the prophet Isaiah as he describes the gifts of the Spirit that the Messiah would possess. Jesus showed the fullness of these gifts to us in his life, teaching, and his death. As he prepared to ascend to the Father, he promised these gifts to us: *The spirit of the Lord shall rest upon him: a spirit of wisdom and of understanding,*

A spirit of counsel and of strength, a spirit of knowledge and of fear of the Lord, and his delight shall be the fear of the Lord.

Let us pray that these gifts, that strengthen in us at our Confirmation, may help us to do what is good and right.

St. Rita is known as a patroness of lost causes, hopeless situations, difficult marriages, troubled homes, and alienated children. Wise people warn, be careful what you pray for. "Divine Savior," Rita prayed, "let me suffer like you!" Obedient to parents who refused her wish to become a nun, Rita married a man who returned her devotion with twenty years of abuse. When enemies murdered him, Rita's two sons swore revenge. Paintings depict her pointing the angry boys toward Christ crucified, whom she begged to restrain them. Within the year, both sons died. Alone now, Rita went to the convent but was refused. The nuns feared violence, since one of them was related to the murderer. Rita arranged peace between the families, made vows, and became much sought after as a counselor and intercessor for forty years on earth—and ever since in heaven. —Peter Scagnelli, Copyright © J. S. 
