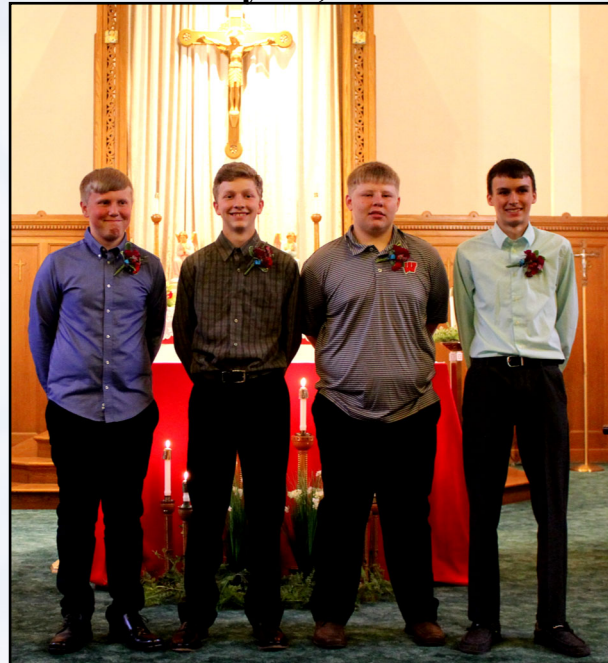

**Evangelization—Bishop Hying**

Bishop Hying wants all Catholics in the diocese to commit to evangelization. Since we cannot share what we do not possess ourselves. He has four simple things that we can do to grow in faith.

1. Develop or strengthen a habit of going to confession regularly, ideally at least once per month.
2. Prioritize Sunday as the Lord’s Day in your lives especially by attending Mass.
3. Commit to spending at least 15 minutes per day in prayer, ideally praying often with Scripture.
4. Make asceticism (voluntary practices of self-denial) a regular part of their lives, beginning with at least the mandatory observance of Fridays as penitential fasting.

**We Need the Mass**

We can never forget that, on the last night of His earthly life, as Jesus faced betrayal, arrest, mockery, torture, and the Cross, He was thinking of us, not Himself.

At the Last Supper, the Lord wanted to give us the most profound, enduring, intimate, and saving expression of His love for us; wanting to remain with us always, He gave us Himself in the most Holy Eucharist.

This Blessed Sacrament is the greatest gift the Lord could have offered us; as St. John Vianney reminds us if God had something better or greater to give us, He would have given us that.

**What we do at the Mass**

The Mass is our participation in the life, death, and Resurrection of Christ. We offer our lives, especially the past week’s prayer, work, joy, suffering, sacrifice, and love to the Father, in union with Jesus on the altar.

The bread and wine symbolize our gifts to the Lord and we receive our offering back, now transformed into the Body and Blood of Christ.

This holy exchange is the ongoing renewal, continuation, and indeed, the consummation of the marriage between Christ and His Bride, the Church.

In Mass, we thank the Lord for the inestimable gift of salvation offered to us through the Crucifixion, death, and rising of Jesus.

We have been saved from an eternal existence of sin, shame, despair, hopelessness, death, and separation from God.

We have been saved for grace, mercy, joy, peace, forgiveness, and eternal union with the Blessed Trinity. Realizing what we have been saved from and who we have been saved for draws us to a posture of profound gratitude, worship, and praise. (continued next week)

**SAINT CHARLES LWANGA and HIS COMPANIONS-(martyred 1886-87) June 3**

"Master of Pages," reputedly the handsomest man in all Uganda, Charles Lwanga, lay catechist, courageously led about forty teenaged boys, Catholics and Anglicans, on a forty-mile forced march to martyrdom for their common Christian faith. Teaching each other the hymns of their different churches, they strengthened one another for the ordeal ahead. King Mwanga, himself barely twenty, had ordered them executed for being "those who pray." But these royal pages were the king's male harem, who, now Christians, refused what pious accounts demurely describe as his "unreasonable demands." Some were clubbed to death, most burned alive; the youngest, thirteen-year old Saint Kizito, whom Charles had often shielded from the King's lust; the most tragic, Saint Mbaga, whose father was his executioner! In 1964, Paul VI canonized the young Catholics and praised their Anglican companions, recalling the heroism of early Christianity's African martyrs, which we modern Christians of far less faith never expected to see repeated. Forty years after the pope's words, what does our faith cost us? Heroism aside, how generous is our response?

**FEAST OF FAITH**

**Liturgy and the Holy Trinity**

The Trinity is the central mystery of our faith. We believe that God is one, yet three: total unity and rich diversity. God is not a monolith, but a dynamic community of persons, a perfect, loving harmony of three. And the liturgy is the work of the Trinity. We begin all our liturgical celebrations with the sign of the cross, a reminder of our Trinitarian baptism, and the simplest of all professions of our faith. We believe that God is Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, and we gather in the name of this triune God. Throughout the Mass, we address our prayers to God the Father, through Christ our Lord, in the Spirit's power. And the Father hears our prayer, transforming bread and wine into the Body and Blood of his Son by the Holy Spirit. The Church is "the sacrament of trinitarian communion" (*Sacramentum Caritatis*, 16). It is the Trinity who holds us together as well. In the words of Saint Cyprian, we are "a people made one by the unity of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit" (quoted in *Sacramentum Caritatis*, 16).

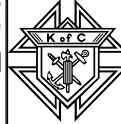

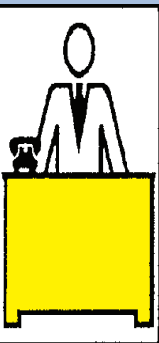
