GOD'S TIME

We either pay attention to or ignore “clock time” as we play in the summer sun and note the earth’s tilt and the lengthening days. We live by time. We reckon time in seconds and minutes and hours, or we use broader chunks like supertime and summertime.

God keeps another sort of time. God speaks to us of “saving time,” that is, the time of salvation. This sense of time is called *kairos*, and this time is always now, always present and available, always revealing, often surprising.

This Sunday’s readings alert us to the reality and the import of God’s time. Ezekiel and the Gospel of Mark remind us that our labor and our plotting and our planning rest in God. For God takes our smallest efforts and makes of them great works. Paul points us to the “harvest” time, urges us to be watchful for its coming, and calls us to recognize that we must spend our time pleasing God. Copyright © J. S. Paluch Co.

The Oblates of the Virgin Mary in Nigeria Mission Appeal Next Weekend

The Congregation of the Oblates of the Virgin Mary (OMV) is a religious institute founded in Italy in 1816 by Ven. Fr. Bruno Lanteri (1759-1830) and his companions. The Oblate spirituality is rooted in Christ under the guidance of the Blessed Virgin Mary. They have a deep love for the Blessed Sacrament, for the Church and fidelity to the Magisterium. The OMV are present in Nigeria since 1998. In Nigeria, more than 300 applicants per year request to enter the seminary. Quality is emphasized in the acceptance of aspirants. The OMV is still young in Nigeria and it is growing. Today, it currently has:

Five communities present in five Nigerian dioceses (Abuja, Benin City, Ibadan, Lagos, Suleja). Thirty-five priests, deacon and perpetually professed members. Twelve are currently serving outside Nigeria.

Due to the growing number of students in formation, they need to *build a new seminary complex* in Ibadan city, (Southwest Nigeria). Presently, the Formators and seminarians in the Oblates’ seminary are accommodated in a rented, hardly adequate, house with only fifteen rooms. The financial cost of training and sustenance of our seminarians is large. Please be generous in your support of our Mission next weekend.

Evangelization—Bishop Hying

Bishop Hying wants all Catholics in the diocese to commit to evangelization. Since we cannot share what we do not possess ourselves. He has four simple things that we can do to grow in faith.

1. Develop or strengthen a habit of going to confession regularly, ideally at least once per month.
2. Prioritize Sunday as the Lord’s Day in your lives especially by attending Mass.
3. Commit to spending at least 15 minutes per day in prayer, ideally praying often with Scripture.
4. Make asceticism (voluntary practices of self-denial) a regular part of their lives, beginning with at least the mandatory observance of Fridays as penitential fasting, days throughout the year.

St. Anthony of Padua—June 13

St. Anthony of Padua is one of the Catholic Church's most popular saints. Saint Anthony, patron saint of lost and stolen articles, was a powerful Franciscan preacher and teacher. He's typically portrayed holding the child Jesus—or a lily—or a book—or all three—in his arms. He was born in

Fernando Martins in 1195 in Lisbon, Portugal to a wealthy family and by the age of fifteen asked to be sent to the Abbey of Santa Cruz in Coimbra, the then capital of Portugal.

Following his ordination to the priesthood, Fernando eventually received permission to join a new Franciscan Order and he changed his name to Anthony.

Anthony then traveled to Morocco to spread God's truth, but became extremely sick and was returned to Portugal to recover. The return voyage was blown off-course and he arrived in Sicily. As he recovered, Anthony spent his time praying and studying. Later Anthony delivered an eloquent and moving homily that impressed a group of Dominican and Franciscan friars. Soon, news of his eloquence reached St. Francis of Assisi, and in Anthony, he found a friend.

Anthony occasionally taught at the universities, but he was best in the role of a preacher. So simple and resounding was his teaching of the Catholic Faith, most of the uneducated could understand his messages. Once, when St. Anthony attempted to preach the true Gospel of the Catholic Church to heretics who would not listen to him, he went out and preached his message to the fish. This was not for the fish, but rather for the glory of God, the delight of the angels, and the easing of his own heart. When critics saw the fish begin to gather, they realized they should also listen to what Anthony had to say.

He was only 35-years-old when he died and was canonized less than one year afterward by Pope Gregory IX.

FEAST OF FAIT-The Preparation of the Altar

The altar is the focal point of our churches. It is a sign of Christ in our midst; indeed, it has been said that "the altar is Christ" (*Dedication of an Altar*, 4). The altar is a table "on which the sacrifice of the cross is perpetuated in mystery throughout the ages until Christ comes"; but it is also the place for a festive meal: "a table at which the Church's children assemble to give thanks to God and receive the body and blood of Christ" (*Dedication of an Altar*, 4).

Both these functions of the altar are clear in the rites for the preparation of the altar that follow the general intercessions, which remind us of the preparations we make at home for a festive meal. The deacon or altar servers come forward and, bowing, place a cloth known as a corporal (from the Latin for "body") over the altar cloth. They place the chalice, the cup to be used in the celebration of the Eucharist, and the *Sacramentary* or *Roman Missal*, which contains the prayers of the Mass, on the altar. These reverent preparations help us to focus on what is about to happen: the sharing of a holy meal, a solemn sacrifice. —Corinna Laughlin, Copyright © J. S. Paluch Co.

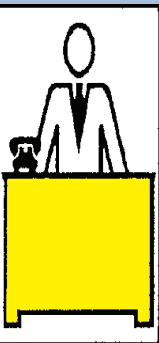
