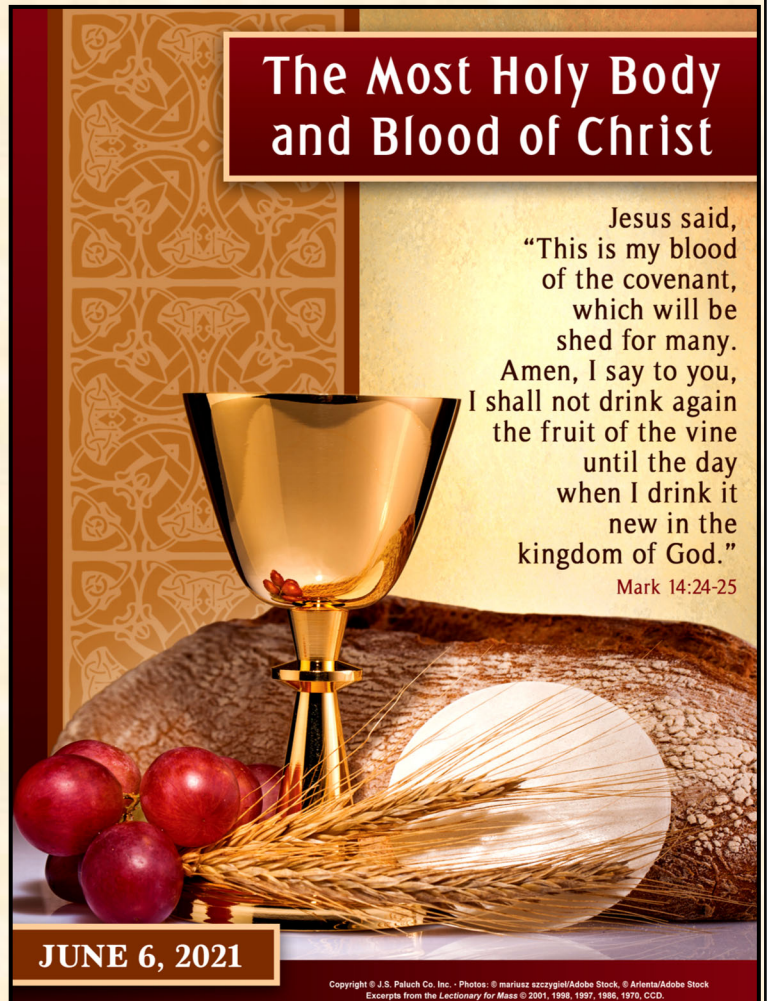

Most of us realize now how much we miss receiving the Eucharist for an extended period of time. Therefore, let us approach the table of the Lord today in joy and gratitude for God's abiding presence in this sacred meal.

We Need the Mass

When I was in second grade, my mother went back to work half-time at a Catholic nursing home as a nurse. We would all go to the vigil Mass on Saturday night because she would be gone to work by 5 a.m. the next morning. On Sunday, my father would get us out of bed and make us go to Mass again. I never resisted going to Mass every week, but I did struggle with going to the same liturgy within 14 hours, often with the same priest and homily.

When I voiced my desire to stay in bed, my father would say, "Don't you think God has done enough for you this week, that you can give Him TWO hours of praise and thanks?" What do you do in response to such a statement, except get up and go!

My parents deeply understood the Eucharist as our response of thanks for all that God has done for us, especially the offer of salvation in His Son.

Maybe we will never fully understand the Mass until we feel in our guts the depths of God's love for us, the worth of our soul to God, the fact that Jesus literally traded His life for ours on the cross, that we have been rescued from something absolutely dark and terrible and ushered into the Kingdom of light. Ultimately, Mass is not about us being entertained, feeling good, or getting an energy charge to make it through the week.

It is about the worship and praise of God, gathering as the Church to hear the Word proclaimed in the ageless Scriptures, sharing in the Paschal offering of Jesus to the Father, and receiving the Body of the Lord. The Son of God descends upon our altars, not to remain in golden vessels, but to be consumed by us, to be digested into us, so that we become completely united with Him in this Eucharistic intimacy!

What an astonishing gift! How much the Lord loves us! I am convinced that, if every Catholic both understood and believed the truth of the Real Presence in the Most Holy Eucharist, our churches would be packed, not only on Sundays but every single day of the year.

I remember a debate I had years ago with an evangelical pastor, discussing the implications of the sixth chapter of John's Gospel, which is Jesus' beautiful Eucharistic discourse.

He told me that, if he believed in the Eucharist as Catholics do, that in the Blessed Sacrament, we have the fullness of Jesus Christ — Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity, he would go up the church aisle on his knees to receive such an amazing gift.

Evangelization—Bishop Hying

Bishop Hying wants all Catholics in the diocese to commit to evangelization. Since we cannot share what we do not possess ourselves. He has four simple things that we can do to grow in faith.

1. Develop or strengthen a habit of going to confession regularly, ideally at least once per month.
2. Prioritize Sunday as the Lord's Day in your lives especially by attending Mass.
3. Commit to spending at least 15 minutes per day in prayer, ideally praying often with Scripture.
4. Make asceticism (voluntary practices of self-denial) a regular part of their lives, beginning with at least the mandatory observance of Fridays as penitential fasting, days throughout the year.

SACRIFICE

Today the Church focuses on the Eucharist. Today's readings remind us how connected to ancient blood sacrifices we are when offering our unbloody sacrifice. The reading from Exodus describes a solemn ritual designed so the Israelites would never forget their covenant with God.

The reading from the Letter to the Hebrews turns us from those ancient animal sacrifices, the first efforts to worship the living God. Our sacrifice is the body and blood of the Son of God. Because of Christ we have a new covenant.

The Gospel from Mark retells the establishment of that covenant, the familiar story of the Last Supper. Juxtaposed with the story of animal sacrifice as it is here, we are challenged to listen with new attention, to remember the great price paid for our salvation. St. Boniface—June 5

St. Boniface was an English Benedictine monk who devote his life to the conversion of the Germanic tribes. Two characteristics stand out: his Christian orthodoxy and his fidelity to the pope of Rome.

In 719 At the request of Pope Gregory II, Boniface made his first missionary journey to the tribes. Paganism was a way of life and what Christianity he found had either lapsed into paganism or was mixed with error. The clergy were mainly responsible for these latter conditions since they were in many instances uneducated, lax and questionably obedient to their bishops. In particular instances their very ordinations were questionable.

In 722 on his first return visit to Rome, the Holy Father instructed him to reform the German Church. The pope sent letters of recommendation to religious and civil leaders including Charles Martel, the powerful Frankish ruler, grandfather of Charlemagne. Boniface was finally made a regional bishop and authorized to organize the whole German Church. He was eminently successful, but he met great problems in the Frankish kingdom because of lay interference in bishops' elections, the worldliness of the clergy and lack of papal control.

During a final mission to the Frisians, Boniface and 53 companions were massacred on June 5, 754.

Feast of Faith-The Corpus Christi Procession

In the thirteenth century, a Belgian nun by the name of Juliana had a vision: she saw the full moon silvery and radiant except for one dark spot. The meaning of the vision was revealed to her: the moon was the Church's liturgical year, the dark spot a missing feast in honor of the Blessed Sacrament. Today's feast of *Corpus Christi*—the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ—grew from Juliana's vision.

On this feast, many parishes observe the traditional *Corpus Christi* procession, giving honor to the Eucharist by carrying this greatest treasure out of the safety of our churches and into our streets. At the end of every Mass we are not just let out, we are sent forth, strengthened by the Eucharist, to be the Body of Christ in the world. The *Corpus Christi* procession is the dismissal writ large! We take Jesus with us, not only in our hearts, but carried in our midst and exposed in a monstrance. It is a public profession of faith and a blessing of the world. Jesus walks with us on these streets that we walk day after day, among those who know him but yearn to know him better, and among those who do not know him. The Eucharist is a mystery to be believed, to be celebrated—and to be lived.

Celebrate Life

The Eucharist is, finally, the Sacrament of Love. St. John explains, "This is how we know

what love is: Jesus Christ laid down his life for us" (1Jn.3:16). Christ teaches, "Greater love than this no one has, than to lay down his life for his friends" (Jn.15:13). The best symbol of love is not the heart, but rather the crucifix.

Abortion is the exact opposite of love. Love says, "I sacrifice myself for the good of the other person. Abortion says, "I sacrifice the other person for the good of myself." In the Eucharist we see the meaning of love and receive the power to live it. The very same words, furthermore, that the Lord uses to teach us the meaning of love are also used by those who promote abortion: "This is my body." These four little words are spoken from opposite ends of the universe, with totally opposite results. Christ gives His body away so others might live; abortion supporters cling to their own bodies so others might die. Christ says "This is My Body *given up for you*; This is My Blood *shed for you*." These are the words of sacrifice; these are the words of love.—Priests for Life website, June 6, 2021

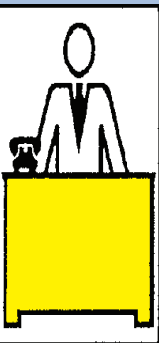
