Nineteenth Sunday

Today we continue hearing Jesus explain to the disciples, the curious, and the skeptical that he is the bread of life, sent from heaven to give his body so that we may have life forever. First we hear Elijah, one of the greatest figures in the centuries before Christ, literally pray for death because of his desperate circumstances. He is saved by an angel of the Lord, who gives him what he needs to sustain him on his journey to God. May we be nourished by the gift of the Holy Eucharist—the very Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity of Christ to sustain us on our journey.

Knowing What the Church Teaches & Why

I have included the second part of Bishop Hying's column from the July 15th issue of the Catholic Herald. Please read and reflect on his words.

The Church wants to be close to every person, especially the poor, the sick, and the vulnerable, but also those who experience racism and prejudice, those who struggle with gender dysphoria, or are same-sex attracted.

Because someone does not agree with or live by all of the Church's teachings does not mean that the Church rejects them or stops loving them. On the contrary, She wants to be even closer to those who have turned aside from faith or do feel rejected by the Church.

Two extremes seem operative in the Church today: Those who simply want the Church to change, omit, or at least de-emphasize those teachings which they disagree with and those who want the Church to come down with an iron fist on those who dissent from Church teaching. I hear regularly from both points of view.

The former hold up love at the price of truth and the latter embrace truth but often without charity. **Jesus always fused love and truth; He loved sinners, accepted and welcomed them, but in order to call them to conversion and the abundance of the Gospel life.** He did not leave them in their sin.

Love without truth becomes empty, vacuous, and sentimental; truth without love becomes harsh, judgmental, and rigid. Jesus and His Church always hold them together.

In the light of so much false ideology regarding the human person, gender, sexuality, and life, we owe it to each other, especially our children, to factually know, coherently understand, lovingly articulate, and generously live the Church's teaching on these matters.

In light of the racial tensions, economic disparity, and global poverty we face, we owe it to each other, especially our children, to factually know, coherently understand, lovingly articulate, and generously live the Church's teachings on these matters as well.

If you have not already done so, I encourage you to read and study the *Catechism of the Catholic Church*. If there is a doctrine or teaching you do not understand or even disagree with, focus on that. Try to understand the "why" behind the "what" of the Catholic belief.

See the inner theological and moral logic which hold the entire *Catechism* together as a profound synthesis of God's Word, spoken to us through Jesus and mediated through the Scriptures and the Tradition. Today, more than ever, we need to be formed as knowledgeable Catholics in order to go and make disciples.

**ST. TERESA BENEDICTA (Edith Stein) (1891-1942) August 9**

Enraged at the Dutch bishops' condemnation of their genocide, the Nazis took into custody all Catholic converts from Judaism. Born Jewish, but non-practicing from her teens, Edith's search for truth led

to a doctorate in philosophy, a brilliant career as professor and author and, finally, to the *Autobiography of Saint Teresa of Ávila*, which she read in one sitting, then declared, "That is the Truth!" She was Baptized on January 1, 1922, and then Confirmed on February 2. Edith entered the cloistered Carmelites in Cologne. Later she and her sister Rosa were transferred to a convent in Holland because of the Nazi persecution of the Jews. After the Dutch Bishop's statement on July 26, 1942, she and other Catholic converts were arrested by the SS. She died in the gas chambers of Auschwitz as a daughter of Israel and of the Church. —Peter Scagnelli, Copyright © J. S. Paluch Co., Inc.

FEAST OF FAITH -Sanctus, Sanctus, Sanctus: Song of Heaven

The words of the Sanctus are rooted in the scriptures. They recall the song of the seraphim in the prophet Isaiah's vision of God in majesty: "Seraphim were stationed above; each of them had six wings: with two they veiled their faces, with two they veiled their feet, and with two they hovered aloft. 'Holy, holy, holy is the LORD of hosts!' they cried one to the other. 'All the earth is filled with his glory!'" (Isaiah 6:2-3). They recall the Gospel accounts of Jesus' entry into Jerusalem: "Hosanna to the Son of David; blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord; hosanna in the highest" (Matthew 21:9). Yet the liturgy adds something new to these ancient texts. The seraphim sang, "the earth is filled with his glory." But the liturgy proclaims, "heaven and earth are full of your glory." In the Eucharist, earth and heaven meet. For a moment in time, we join in the song that the angels sing for all time. The Sanctus raises us to heaven, but does not remove us from the earth. It is the song of the King who took on our human flesh so that we might share in his divine life.


